Petition addressed to King Louis XIV by Moliere pleading for the lifting of the ban on the performance of 'Tartuffe'.

The duty of comedy being to correct men's errors in the course of amusing them ... the idea occurred to me, Sire, that I should render no small service to all good men, if I wrote a play attacking hypocrites ... I have left no room for uncertainty; I have omitted everything which might lead anyone to confuse good with evil and I have employed in the portrayal those colours and characteristics best calculated to make a veritable and downright hypocrite immediately recognizable. Nevertheless the Tartuffes have surreptitiously contrived to find favour with Your Majesty and the people whom the picture portrays have managed to suppress it, salutary though it was in intention, and accurate though the likeness was admitted to be.
