
Friel himself has referred to his work as realising 'Concepts of Irishness'

# About the Author

Willy Russell was born in Whiston, just outside Liverpool. According to Russell, they talk funny in Whiston. To a Liverpudlian everyone else talks funny. He left school at fifteen. He went through a succession of jobs, including ladies hairdressing, before, at the age of twenty, he enrolled at college to take his 'O' and 'A' levels. Finally he became a teacher.

He did not realise the autobiographical content of Educating Rita until it was pointed out to him sometime after the play had opened.

Other successful plays by Willy Russell include 'John, Paul, George, Ringo and Bert', 'Stags and Hens', 'Blood Brothers' and 'Shirley Valentine'.
