

Historical Notes

- 1154 Henry II comes to the throne and makes Becket Archdeacon of Canterbury
- 1155 Becket made Chancellor
- 1158-60 Becket a general and treaty-maker in France
- 1162 Becket made Archbishop, resigns Chancellorship
- 1164 Becket exiled
- 1166-69 Becket excommunicates Royal Councillors and Bishops
- 1170, July Henry, threatened by the Pope, is reconciled with Becket
- December Becket returns via Woodstock and Harrow, and is murdered at Canterbury
- 1172 Becket canonized, and Henry II does penance at Becket's shrine

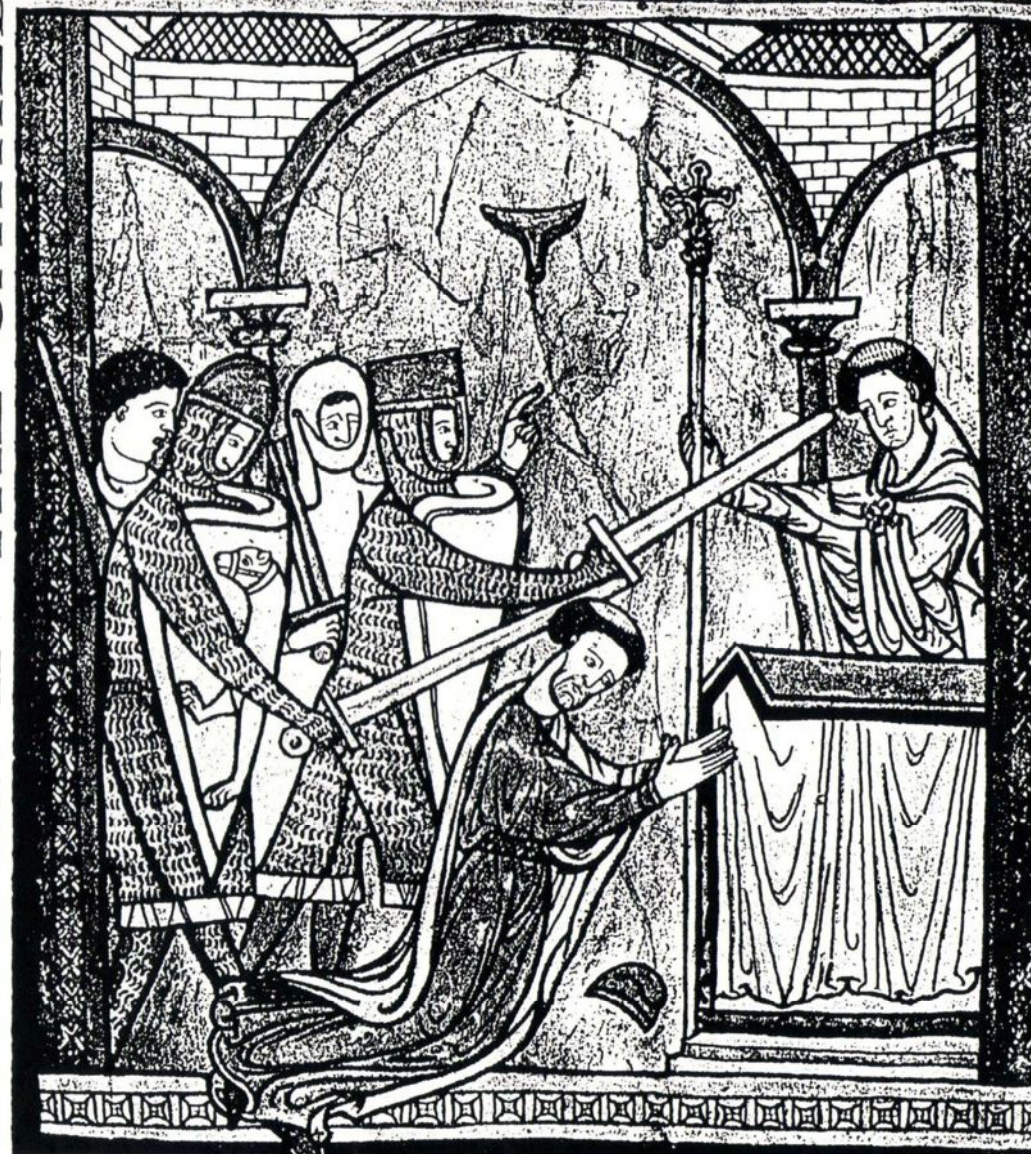
