For Fanny's First Play a symbolical set has been designed by Michael Davies somewhat in the Topolski manner. The gaps between the scene flats are deliberate, suggesting that Shaw, the iconoclast, is breaking down the walls to let in the light of reason and the air of freedom from Shibboleth. The period is 1911. George V has been King but a year and Edwardianism is still rampant. The White City, emblem of the entente cordiale, is the newest thing. Edwardes is still in power at Daly's Theatre, where the Merry Widow flourished so long. Beards and moustaches are still to be found at Lord's and the cup-tie final at the Crystal Palace. Elgar is the leading British composer. The Insurance Act and the Parliament Bill fill the twenty-four-page papers. Ulster will arm against Home Rule. The Women's Suffrage Movement has become militant—scuffles with the police are daily occurrences. Graham White has flown non-stop from Hendon to Lichfield. Hyde Park is still full of carriages in the afternoon, but motor cars and motor buses are making many appearances. There are big revivalist meetings led by the American evangelists Torrey and Alexander, while another Alexander has arrived with a rag-time band.

This is the scene for our play.
