A NOTE ON THE PLAY

Arthur Miller has based his play on one of the strangest and most awful episodes in history, the witch hunting which occurred in Salem in 1692. Dramatic purposes have required some of the characters to be reduced in number or condensed but Miller assures us that the essential nature of the tragedy can be discovered in the text of his play.

The small town of Salem had been established hardly forty years before these events. To the European world the whole province of Massachusetts was a barbaric frontier inhabited by a sect of fanatics who nevertheless were shipping out products of increasing quantity and value. The people of Salem were not quite the dedicated folk who arrived in the Mayflower; in their own time a revolution had unseated the royal government and substituted a junta, which was in power at this time. We can look back at the repressions and prohibitions of this ferocious theocracy, at the loss of respect and at the individual villainy. And Miller says we can only pity them all—just as we shall be pitied some day.
