GEORGE FARQUHAR

Born in Londonderry. Entered Trinity College, Dublin, at age of 17. Acted at Smock Alley Theatre in the same City, encouraged by his friend and fellow Irishman, the actor Robert Wilks. Came to London in 1697: his first comedy, Love and a Bottle, was produced at Drury Lane the following year. The Constant Couple, in 1699, was a triumph with Wilks as Sir Harry Wildair.

Next year he went on recruiting campaigns to Litchfield and Shrewsbury These trips gave him the raw material for his two masterpieces—The Recruiting Officer(1706) and The Beaux Stratagem (1707), both of which were very well received. By the time The Beaux Statagem opened—with Wilks as Archer—he was heavily in dept and very ill, most likely with tuberculosis.

His death occurred around May 20,1707
